Club Ice 2009 - 2010

Skaters who have passed Basic Skills Level 4 or with the express permission of their coach may skate during club ice. The emphasis here is safety. Be aware that there may be high-level skaters on any session.

Skating Season/Schedule

The KCFSC 2009 – 2010 skating season will run from September 9, 2009 through May 1, 2010.

Please note that the Board reserves the right to pre-empt any session for exhibitions or test sessions.

Contract and Punchcard Info

There are two ways to pay for club ice. A skater may contract specific session(s) and/or may purchase punchcards.

A maximum of 25 skaters will be allowed on a session. In the event that a session becomes full, skaters that have contract ice will have first priority. Punchcards skaters will then be allowed on a first-come, first-serve basis. If a session is full, then a punchcard skater may take the place of an absent contract skater 5 minutes into the skating session according to the clock by the ice. **Each skater needs to check in with the ice monitor upon arrival.** If a skater does not check-in with the ice monitor, the ice monitor is not responsible for the availability of ice for that skater.

Payment Information

The fee structure is as follows:

Payments may be made to the ice monitors in the form of cash or check. There is a \$30 fee for a returned check. A laptop maybe available at some sessions to pay using Paypal or credit card. Check with the ice monitors for information.

Rules for Skaters/Parents

All members are expected to follow proper skating etiquette. Current club rules are as follows:

- 1) All members must be courteous and respectful both on and off the ice. All skaters and professionals must strive to avoid on-ice collisions. Skaters must be careful around those at a higher or lower skating level.
- 2) The skater whose music is playing has the right-of-way. This skater must be wearing a sash provided by the club. Other skaters must yield to the skater wearing the sash.

- 3) Skaters in lessons have right-of-way immediately following the skater wearing the sash.
- 4) Skaters should not hang out in the Lutz corners. Spins should be practiced out of the way of others.
- 5) Ice time is for skating. If extended conversations (other than with coaches) are necessary, the skaters should leave the ice. **Skaters who wish to hold extended conversations need to sit on the bench.**
- 6) The only individuals allow to give instruction to skaters on any club session are KCFSC Home Club and Associate Professional members approved to teach on club ice by the KCFSC Board of Directors.
- 7) Club members that are not on a club session roster must observe from the bleachers and are not allowed to stand by the boards.
- 8) The only individuals that are allowed in the hockey boxes during a club session are contracted skaters, ice monitors, and Board approved KCFSC Home Club and Associate coaches.
- 9) Skaters must not wear iPods, MP3 players, or other such electronic devices. These devices may be played through the stereo system.

If there are any questions about these rules during a session, please see the ice monitor on duty. These rules are subject to change as determined by the KCFSC Board of Directors.

Music Rules

Any skater may have his or her music played during a club ice session. Skaters should submit their CDs to the announcer's box at the beginning of a session. CDs will be played in the order submitted with the following exception:

- Coaches may move a skater's music to the top of the order if that skater is in a lesson.
- Coaches may only pre-empt twice during a given lesson.

Music may only be played three times in one session. A CD may not be restarted except by a coach or in the case of a technical difficulty. After a skater's music is played, it will be placed at the end of the line.

Ice Monitors

Adult non-skating club members wishing to be an ice monitor need to contact Suzy Blair or Marc Osborn. Those members who have served as ice monitors during the previous season will have preference.

All chosen ice monitors will have a list of guidelines and responsibilities. These include procedures for: checking in skaters, collecting monies, playing music, selling punchcards, distributing and collecting sashes, and enforcing rules.

Ice monitors will receive two free punchcards, one before Dec. 31 and another after Dec. 31, to be used during the contract season. Any punchcard may be if a monitor fails to show-up to a scheduled session without an adult non-skater substitute.

If an ice monitor fails to show to any scheduled session without a non-skating adult substitute then the remaining punches on their free punchcard will be void for a part of the season, before or after Dec. 31, will be void.

2009 – 2010 Ice Contract Information

Contract Terms and Conditions

The term of this contract is from September 9th 2009 through May 1th 2010.

Contracted skaters may only skate the sessions they have contracted. A skater may skate other sessions using a make-up session or a punchcard. Contracted skaters will be allowed to make up sessions based on the following: for every hour of contract ice, each skater will be allowed four make-up sessions per year. For example, a skater who has contracted 2 hours per week will be allowed 8 make-up sessions.

On a full session, contracted skaters have first priority. Punchcard skaters have next priority, and contracted skaters making up a session have last priority.

Skaters are allowed to change one contracted session to any available contract session once in the lifetime of the contract. Any additional change(s) to the contracted session(s) is subject to a \$25 change fee.

Any skater contracting for ice between September 9, 2009 and February 1, 2010 will have their contract prorated for that portion of the season remaining provided it is received with the payment for the next quarter. Prorating will be reflected on the next billing cycle. Contracts received after February 1, 2010 must be submitted with the ice fees paid in full to be accepted.

If a skater leaves the sport, this contract can be relinquished to the club with a 50% payment of the remaining ice balance. A contract may be transferred to another skater if the balance of the contract is paid in full. Contracts not paid in full 90 days after the final bill will be sent for collection.

Injuries

If a skater is injured during the span of this contract, the skater is still responsible for timely payment of their contract. An injured skater can submit a written request to the contract billing manager for review by the Board of Directors for an adjustment to their bill. Medical documentation from a physician must be submitted for review. If an adjustment is granted, in no case will the adjustment be greater than 50% of the time off the ice after a four-week continuous waiting period starting on the date of the injury. After a return to any ice surface, the four-week waiting period starts over.

Contract Ice Billing Schedule:

Billing for club ice will be on a quarterly basis. Payment schedule is as follows:

4 th Quarter	February 1, 2010

Contracts must be received with 1st quarter payment to be accepted. You will be billed for subsequent quarters and payment is due upon receipt of billing. The bill will be considered late 30 days after mailing of bills. Skaters whose payments are late will be considered to be “not in good standing” which means they will not be allowed to test or compete. There is a \$30 late fee charge charged thirty days after the due date. A \$30 fee will be charged on all returned checks.

Step 2 - Each Free Skating session will have 31 segments for the season. Each quarter's billing will bill for 7.75 segments per session contracted. The amount you will pay for each segment is determined by the total number of Free Skating sessions per week for your household (the number in the grey box in step #1). The fee schedule is as follows:

1 -2 sessions per week	\$14.00 per segment	\$108.50 a quarter per session
3 – 4 session per week	\$12.00 per segment	\$93 a quarter per session

Quarterly installments will be due at the time of contract, October 1, December 1 and February 1. You will be sent a bill on those dates. Payment is due on receipt and accounts will be considered late 30 days after the issuance of statements. Any skater, whose payment is late will not be allowed to test or compete until the bill is brought up-to-date. Any sessions that are pre-empted will be credited to your account. Non-payment of bill may result in the amount due being sent to collection.

Please note that the club has contracted with the rink for the above ice times, therefore we are contracting ice to our members for the full time period stated for the entire skating season. Inability to receive lessons during your contracted sessions is NOT grounds for voiding this contract. Please check with your coach before contracting. The Board of Directors reserves the right to cancel, limit or reschedule ice sessions, as deemed necessary.
